Lobbying is a strange, but vitally important pastime and at times a bit of a dark art. I refer to the launch and roll out on 1 July of the new Australian national commercial vessel safety scheme that has caused many surveyors considerable angst, which in some cases has even turned to anger. Clearly, it would seem to prove that regulators forging ahead without engaging meaningfully with relevant parties and stakeholders is folly and destined for a problematic outcome. IIMS conducted some research to find out exactly what Australian members thought about the new scheme. The results were revealing and have been circulated to a wide range of interested parties as well as directly to the AMSA CEO and Deputy Prime Minister of Australia. Clearly this one has a long way to run, so watch for developments. In the meantime, the press release published by Marine Business is worth a read - see https://bit.ly/2Jxl3ok.


Australian members' survey conducted, following the launch of the new national commercial vessel

Here are the results from a survey carried out amongst the International Institute of Marine Surveying's Australian membership. The research was open from 9th to 15th July 2018.


The survey attracted a 59% response from IIMS Australian members and the results have been shared with AMSA, the Australian Deputy prime Minister and other interested parties.

Q1. Do you survey Domestic Commercial Vessels in Australia?




changes, on a scale of 1-5 do you think they will have made vessels safer or less safe (1 being far less safe and 5 being much safer)?


Q4. Assuming you are aware of recent survey




Q5. Have these recent changes to survey schedules affected your business in any way?




Q2. Are you aware AMSA is now the only regulator of commercial vessels in Australia?




Q6. AMSA IT and other systems support surveyors properly

The annual Large Yacht & Small Craft Working Group 'super' training day will be held in the Portsmouth area. The agenda is being put together now and details will be released soon.


Tuesday 6 into Wednesday 7 November








Tuesday 27 November

Tuesday 6 into Wednesday 7 November 2018

IIMS set to trial an 8 day practical training module

In a bold initiative as part of its award-winning Professional Qualification in Yacht & Small Craft Marine Surveying, IIMS is set to trial an 8 day practical module for the first time in October 2018.

Prospective students should arrive with an understanding of vessel construction and systems. Over an intensive 64 hours studying, the course will equip students to apply this knowledge to practical surveying techniques and report writing so that they can leave with the ability to carry out surveys on typical 8-10m sailing and motor vessels.

The practical module is planned to take place over a 10-day period (Tuesday to following Thursday) from 16 to 25 October. The course will be delivered from Fox's marina and boatyard, Ipswich, UK and will be run by Aidan Tuckett MIIMS and Martin Evans MYDSA. Both Aidan and Martin are full time surveyors, who have run numerous similar practical courses, training over 100 surveyors in the process, many of whom have gone on to run successful surveying businesses.

Students will cover a variety of topics over the ten-day period which will involve classroom sessions on structures and surveying techniques followed by practical exercises and





demonstrations. Towards the end of the first week and into the

second, students will also carry out monitored surveying exercises and receive individual feedback on their work. On completion students will complete two reports on typical small sailing and motor vessels in their own time and submit these for marking. A brief synopsis of the syllabus:



- Surveying principles and standards
- Engine surveying basics and practical
- Rigging systems practical
- Full vessel survey sail



- Yacht rigs and associated systems
- Gas and electrical systems practical
- Full vessel survey motor

You do not have to be enrolled in the IIMS Professional Qualification programme to take advantage of this opportunity. But if you are already enrolled, undertaking this unit would count as one of the four specialist units necessary for the Yacht and Small Craft Marine Surveying Professional Qualification. Alternatively, it can simply be used to refresh knowledge and gain new skills.

Students should have a laptop with Word software, suitable outdoor clothing for the time of year, a digital camera and notepads. They must have suitable deck shoes to avoid damage to surfaces. Some working at heights (ladders to 3m) and working in confined spaces will be involved. They will need to set aside one day of the middle weekend and around two days after the course is completed to carry out report writing.


The cost of this practical unit is £1,750 (no VAT payable), which covers all training, assessments, course materials and lunch. You are responsible for travel and accommodation. Payment in full is required by Wednesday 12 September latest. IIMS reserves the right to cancel the course four weeks prior to the event if a minimum of eight confirmed students is not reached. The course can accommodate a maximum of twelve people. In the event of a cancellation the course fee will be refunded in full. Small Craft Surveyors Forum seminar report

The Small Craft Surveyors Forum met at the Seawork workboat show in Southampton on the afternoon of 4th July. The event, which attracted an audience of nearly 80 delegates with standing room only, was hailed a great success.

Trevor Blakeley, CEO of RINA, was on hand to welcome delegates and open proceedings. In a slight change to the running order, he introduced Paul Johnston from Euro Marine Surveys first, who spoke eloquently on tonnage measurement, including how to calculate load line length and breaks. Delegates listened intently and by the end of the presentation were left in no doubt that simplified tonnage measurement is anything but simple!

Next to speak was Richard Franklin, Braemar Yacht Services. His topic? Challenges for 24m plus vessel surveyors and mini ISM Code. His presentation gave those present a glimpse into the enticing and challenging world of superyacht surveying. However, he cautioned it because of the complexity of the survey and the knowledge required, advised surveyors to group their specialisms and to approach the assignment together and not single handed.

The afternoon concluded with what turned out to be a lively panel discussion, chaired by Mike Schwarz and supported by a panel of Nick Gladwell, Hugo Morgan-Harris and Richard Linford. Over the best part of an hour, the panel discussed everything from surveyor accreditation, to standards, how to acquire new skills, continuing professional development and the importance of mentoring with timely interventions and comment from the audience.


What will you learn?

- Recap on fundamental corrosion principles including, driving force for electrochemical activity and principles of galvanic corrosion
- An understanding of the corrosion mechanisms that undermine the performance of stainless steel and other 'marine metals' and associated metrics
- An appreciation of what environmental factors influence corrosion above and below the waterline and how this impacts material selection
- Consider how to minimise corrosion through material selection, improved design and other strategies i.e. cathodic protection, changing electrode potential, surface treatments etc.
- Become familiar with important aspects of failure analysis; inspection, sample preparation, analytical techniques and diagnostic methodologies

The day's course will be delivered in six modular sections as follows:

- 1) Corrosion: Fundamental Principles
- 2) Forms of corrosion in 'marine metals'
- 3) Corrosion above the waterline
- 4) Corrosion below the waterline
- 5) Corrosion prevention strategies
- 6) Failure analysis and case studies


