IIMS thought it was overdue that marine surveyors have their own special day – a day that celebrates and recognises the importance of their work and profession. So, IIMS has decided to create the International Marine Surveying Fest 2018, a 24 hour marine surveying jamboree. The date for this innovative and eye catching event, which is brought to you in association with Constellation Marine Services and Nautical Institute, is Tuesday 6th into Wednesday 7th November. No matter what time zone you are in, or area of surveying you work in, we hope to offer something of interest to you.

### How it works

Marine Surveying International Fest 2018 is an online only event and will be anchored and hosted from the IIMS head office in the UK. It is a 24 hour non-stop online marathon of presentations starting at 11.00 hrs UTC on Tuesday 6th November opened by Mike Schwarz, IIMS CEO in discussion with Capt John Lloyd, Nautical Institute CEO and running non-stop until 11.00 hrs on Wednesday 7th November.

Each hour on the hour, a new presentation will be delivered live by a knowledgeable presenter somewhere in the world on a surveying related or business topic. For one fee, you can join the Fest taking advantage of as many of the 24 presentations over the 24 hours as you wish. And if you miss any presentations because the time does not work for you in your location, your fee will give access to the entire content after the Fest, which will be videoed.

If you cannot make the date, but would still like to have access to the video content, which will not be made available publicly, then the fee covers that option too.

### How much does it cost?

The one off fee to participate is just £100 (less than £5 per presentation). This entitles you to join the proceedings, leave at any time and then re-join later, or the next day if you so wish so that you can take the presentations that are of most interest and relevance to you.

On receipt of your booking, you will be given the unique code that will give you access for the whole 24 hour period using the Zoom online platform.
